TTMA Ready to Action Phase 2 'Vaccinate to Operate'

(13th June, 2021) - The Trinidad and Tobago Manufacturers Association (TTMA) is enthused to receive the public announcement by the Minister of Health, the Honourable Terrence Deyalsingh on TTMA's further allocation of 5,000 vaccines to continue phase 2 of our vaccination drive for the business community. This announcement was made at the Prime Minister's Media Conference held on Saturday 12th June.
